The study was conducted from June 15 to September 30, 2019.

- What is the prisoner's personal space?

- Where does the prisoner keep his personal belongings and objects?

- How does the prisoner spend his free time?

- How does a prisoner write letters and make phone calls to his loved ones?







## PERSONAL DATA OF THE PRISONER FEATURES OF PROTECTION







# MEDICAL SECRECY

#### Threat to secrecy

The rules do not define where an employee should be during a medical appointment

#### **Threat to secrecy**

There are cases of prisoners working in the medical unit having access to documents

#### Threat to secrecy

The accompanying employee does not always follow the request to step aside to preserve confidentiality

#### **Threat to secrecy**

In one of the colonies, medical information was indicated on bedside tags

#### **Positive moment**

In one of the regions, the accompanying sheet of the patient was with prescriptions, but without a diagnosis





## IMPLEMENTATION OF RIGHTS IN PRACTICE



In the course of research, it was established

Most phones are located in public areas where outsiders can hear the conversation.

#### In the course of research, it was established

Prisoners are limited to the Russian language. The employee interrupts the conversation because he does not understand what it is about.

## In the course of research, it was established

There are a lot of complaints about the loss of letters. It is unknown whether they are lost in the colony or through the fault of the Russian Post.



## In the course of research, it was established

In the pre-trial detention center, you can call only with the permission of the investigator, who, as a rule, prohibits calls.







## PERSONAL TIME AND PERSONAL SPACE DOES THE PRISONER HAVE THEM?



#### Problem

Many colonies unreasonably prohibit prisoners from designing premises

#### **Problem**

One bedside table for two is allowed in the colony. There are none of them in the pretrial detention centers at all

There are board games, a library, interest clubs, sports

#### **Problem**

The beds are placed close together

#### **Optimistic note**




As a reward for good behavior, it is allowed to watch sports broadcasts

#### Problem

Paper and electronic books, watches and teapots are prohibited in the pre-trial detention centers for no reason





## PRIVATE LIFE AND VULNERABLE CATEGORIES OF PRISONERS PREGNANT WOMEN AND WOMEN WITH CHILDREN



They have special rooms with a shower, a cooking stove, a changing table and toys



A child under 3 years old lives in a children's home at the colony, but communicates with his mother only a few hours (at best) a day



The Federal Penitentiary Service of Russia has 13 colonies with children's homes, which contain about 500 children



After giving birth, the mother could not see the baby for a month, which led to loss of milk, psychological exhaustion, loss of immunity



At the age of 3, the child is given to an orphanage, relatives, or a foster family, which may interrupt his communication with his mother





## PRIVATE LIFE AND VULNERABLE CATEGORIES OF PRISONERS PRISONERS FROM OTHER REGIONS AND STATES

#### Problem

They are most vulnerable in terms of maintaining family ties. The arrival of loved ones is expensive, and telephone conversations are only in Russian.


#### Problem

There are few books in foreign languages in libraries. Many languages are not represented at all.

#### Problem

Communication with prisoners and employees, understanding of internal regulations and normative acts is difficult. There is isolation from all processes in the institution.






## Conditions for visitors with disabilities

#### DURING THE STUDY, THE STAFF DID NOT INTERFERE WITH THE OBSERVERS


In some cases, participation in monitoring prompted prisoners and staff to study the topic. The leadership of the colonies noticed an interest in such information in libraries.



## MONITORING RESULTS MAIN CONCLUSIONS

It is necessary to make available to prisoners all documents that

relate to human rights and freedoms.





#### **№8** Conclusion

The right to receive visits and to have a telephone conversation with loved ones should be unconditional and not depend on the person's characteristics.

#### Conclusion Nº9

It is necessary to improve long-term visiting rooms, taking into account the fact that elderly people, children, and people with disabilities can live there. It is necessary to give opportunity to go outside.

#### Conclusion Nº11

The opportunity to see relatives or say goodbye to a loved one in case of death or serious illness is an important element of the right to family life.

#### Nº10 Conclusion

A meeting through glass or in the presence of an employee is an excessive restriction. It should be used only in exceptional cases.

## Nº12 Conclusion

It should be noted that there is a positive trend in the implementation of the right to go on leave outside the colony in recent years, which needs to be developed.



It is necessary to continue to reduce the percentage of prisoners serving sentences in regions far from their place of residence.


